No Fall Zone

Remember when we were kids and your mom told you "not to walk across the monkey bars because you could fall and get hurt?" Of course you did it anyway and played on, w h e e e !

On a beautiful, blue sky day at Mammoth Mt. Calif. I went out to ski with best friend Dale Kennedy and a small group of E.T.M.M. adventurers. Our local host Eric, "the Viking", led us. He gave of his time to take us on a chance of a lifetime tour of the tougher parts of the mountain. Eric showed us easier ways to enter the DOUBLE BLACK DIAMONDS or NO FALL ZONES so we could enjoy the areas.

Dale and I had always thought of double blacks as areas we would never get to ski. We had always defined these areas as chutes and steeps where a fall would be 90% likely to cause injury or at least pain. Most ski mountains put little signs up saying "any fall is likely to cause bodily injury." So knowing all of this ahead of time, we played on, w h e e e !

Our little group was on our last run Thursday, another double black. It wasn't the steepest pitch we had done that day but looking up the hill after three turns, it did resemble a frozen waterfall. We held on by the metal edge of our ski's the flat of the ski suspended in air.

I went down a few more turns and waited for the others then suddenly, I heard the sound of a ski skipping down the icy wall above me. Dale went by me like a crash dummy bouncing over mounds with one ski on. As he hit a V.W. size bump he looked at me with a frozen "Mr. Bill" expression on his face. He rolled and missed the rocks and continued into the bowl area leaving a debris trail and approaching terminal velocity. No one said a word; even Dale went quietly disappearing down the mountain without yelling anything.

When I reached Dale he was face down and very still. I had to ask the age old stupid question "are you all right?" He looked up at me and smiled. "I'm sure I broke my arm but it doesn't hurt, yet!" He had stayed still because he felt it break near the top probably when he hit the big bump and gave me that "Mr. Bill Oh No" look! He held his right arm in with his left hand to keep from doing more harm as he slid between the rocks and over the moguls into the bowl.

While laying face down he had packed snow around his right arm like an ice cast. The ski patrol was very impressed with this. The crew of excellent ski patrol members arrived and crated Dale down the mountain. I skied as fast as I could, but could not even keep up with these guys and the sled.

After a late night date with a local orthopedic surgeon, Dale is the proud owner of a titanium plate and screws in his right radius. He has the x-ray film to prove it.

The moral of a No Fall Zone: if you can ski, a double black can be done if you are mentally ready to challenge it. Use a guide and make sure you and your equipment are up to it. Dale's ski came off because it wasn't tight enough for extreme skiing. He never complained of the pain or blamed anyone else for his accident. I am proud to have a great friend like Dale Kennedy who fell but handled the downfall magnificently even though he scare our group and everyone on the gondola lift to death. Thanks again to Eric for a truly fantastic day of adventure skiing.

Heal fast and well, Dale. There will be more snow next year to play on, w h e e e e!

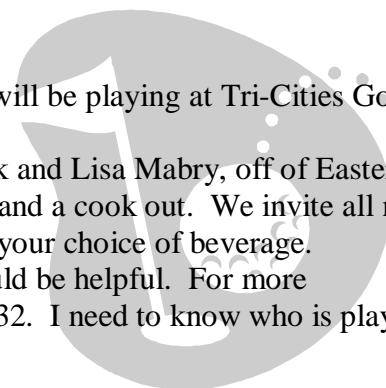
Direction to Lisa & Mark Mabry's new home:

What makes popping corn pop?

Corn is a generic term to describe the fruit (grain) of cereal plants in particular. In Britain corn generally refers to wheat. However, in the US, the word corn refers to maize. Popping corn is just one of the many varieties of maize grown commercially.

The bulk of tissue within a grain of corn is called the endosperm. Endosperm is specialized storage tissue providing nutrients for the embryo when the seed germinates. It is also a source of carbohydrates for humans. In popcorn, the outer part of the endosperm is hard but the center is soft. When the corn is heated, the water in the central part turns to steam causing the seed to burst (the pop that you hear) and turn inside out.

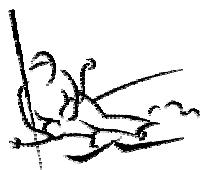
